# **Epiphany of the Lord**

On the Christian calendar, Epiphany is always January 6—the twelfth day of Christmas. On that day (or the Sunday closest to it), we celebrate the belief that in the birth of Jesus at Christmas, God entered our world and our



lives—and changed everything. We hear the story told only in Matthew's Gospel, of guiding stars and foreboding dreams, of a strange cast of characters whose lives were inexplicably altered by the baby mysterious travelers from the East who were compelled to seek him, a jealous

and violent king who was driven to destroy him, and the innocents who were slaughtered instead of him.

Epiphany invites us to wonder where we see God made manifest among us now; to look for the signs of the sacred in our midst; to consider if our worship of Jesus reflects the reverence, the awe, the joy that an encounter with God ought to inspire; to ponder how our lives are transformed as a result of knowing the one we call Christ.

On **January 6**, we will commemorate Epiphany with our own star words and the sacrament of Holy Communion.



commence. We will read the New York Times bestseller, *Accidental Saints: Finding God in All the Wrong People.* 





Session held a stated meeting on December 18, 2019. Following are highlights of the meeting:

- 12 out of 14 elders were present, as were the 4 elderselect and other guests
- Received Dave Briggs as a member by reaffirmation of faith and Liz Briggs by profession of faith. They will publicly profess their faith during worship on December 23, 2018;
- Examined elders-elect Becky Briggs, Pat de Place, Matt Smiley, and Rita Torrey as to their readiness to serve, and set January 6, 2019 as the date for their ordinations/installations:
- Expressed gratitude to Jim Anderson, Carol McLindent, Diana Szaras, Lisa Taylor, and Rick Welchans, for whom this was the last session meeting of their
- Approved a Membership Roll Review Policy to assist the Congregational Care team in guiding the Session through its responsibility of conducting an annual membership review;
- Voted to receive a Christmas Eve offering designated for Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, which is assisting the community of Taylorville that was recently struck by a tornado. Worshipers will be invited to put their offering in the wooden box as they enter/leave the sanctuary;
- Affirmed the worship team's proposal to apply for a Vital Worship Grant through the Calvin Institute of Christian Worship;
- Voted to replace the sanctuary entrance doors;
- Determined that fob/PIN access for the new doors will be limited to church staff, our upstairs tenants, and team chairs.
- Approved being the site of the Danville Winter Farmers' Market, which will be held in the gym on the second Saturdays of February, March, April, May (perhaps), November, and December, 10:00 AM-2:00 PM. Vendors will pay \$5 per day, \$10 per day if they use electrical outlets.
- Approved Gift Acceptance Policies and Procedures and a Managed Funds Investment Policy as presented by the Finance Team.






