

Holy Week

Palm Sunday: Holy Week begins on April 14 with Palm/Passion Sunday, which commemorates Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem for his final Passover meal. It is a day of joy (palms)—as the crowd celebrates the arrival of their King, and a day of sorrow (passion)—as the inevitability of Jesus' arrest becomes apparent. We will experience the highs and lows of that event during our Palm Sunday service.

New Edition will host the Palm Sunday Brunch following worship. They will provide a variety of egg casseroles and praline-topped French toast casserole. Please bring breakfast breads to share.

Maundy Thursday: We will worship on Maundy Thursday, **March 29**, at 6:00 PM, sharing the Lord's Supper and hearing the Word of God through a drama.

Good Friday: On this day of sorrow, we will commemorate Jesus' crucifixion and death in a somber worship service at 7:00 PM.

Easter: Resurrection of Our Lord

Sunrise Service: All who want to start their Easter morning early are invited to a casual 6:15 AM service with communion at Cloud 9 (at the Danville Airport) to rejoice in Jesus' resurrection.

Worship in the Sanctuary: In response to God's resurrection of Jesus Christ, we will joyfully proclaim "He is risen! He is risen indeed!" God's persistent grace will be evident in our 9:45 celebration of the sacraments of the Lord's Supper and Baptism, and in all the sights and sounds of Resurrection Sunday.

Easter Egg Hunt: At 11:00 AM, the youth will have an Easter egg hunt for the younger children. In the event of rain, the hunt will be in the sanctuary; otherwise, the children should be prepared to go outside.

Dear Friends,

In our corner of the world, new life is evident everywhere. What has been quiet, dormant, or absent during the winter is emerging. The birds sing us awake after the cold silence of recent months. Bright green shoots are pushing through the dirt, promising blossoms soon. The rabbits have returned to our backyard, renewing our dog's vigilance against the invaders of her territory. We see transformation all around us—as though the Earth is coming alive again. Easter isn't so hard to grasp during April in Illinois.

In parts of the southern hemisphere, it is the seasonal equivalent of our October. There are fewer hours of daylight, leaves are falling from trees, and temperatures are getting cooler. When everything appears to be slowing and dying, and the signs of rebirth are not so evident, what must the celebration of Easter feel like?

I suspect it feels like life. Joyce Rupp writes that "Easter is about 'tomb watches.' It is about love that keeps vigil and waits and believes in life, no matter how dark and empty and cold the inner space feels. Easter is about hope that is willing to sit in the tomb while it trusts in transformation. Easter is about faithful companions who keep watch with us and cheer us on as we wait for our inner resurrection."

In these last weeks of Lent, as we anticipate the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus—and our own eventual resurrection some day, we know what it is to wait and watch and trust and hope and believe that, despite all evidence to the contrary, death is not the final word. Life is God's word to us and God's desire for us—and for all the Earth.

So enjoy the glorious sights, sounds, and smells of spring. And remember that God is in the business of transformation throughout the year and throughout the ages, in the natural world, in the church, and in us.

I would be remiss if I did not say one more time that the installation service last month was so meaningful. To all of you who were able to attend on that cold, snowy March day and extend warm hospitality to family, friends, and fellow Presbyterians; to Dotty, Jan, Linda, Josh, Michael, and the choir for the incredible music; to the deacons for the delightful reception—Myanne for the food, Kolby for

the punch, all of them for their hard work and dishwashing; to Linda and Jim Anderson for making the lounge and library look so beautiful and inviting; to the staff for their support and oh so many gifts; and for your cards and gifts and expressions of grace, I am humbled and grateful. I am also honored to be your pastor.

We Welcome The Dwelling Place

For more than six months, since the Mission Team proposed the idea, the Session has been trying to discern if we might be the right home for The Dwelling Place, a new ministry that is committed to serving children and adults throughout Vermilion County who are homeless and who live with housing insecurity. Currently, they are distributing hygiene and household products in Danville, Hoopeston, and Georgetown.

Eventually, The Dwelling Place will open—probably toward the end of 2019—as a daytime drop-in center where folks will be able to wash their clothes, shower, get assistance from TDP staff and volunteers in searching for housing and jobs and other community resources, and feel safe.

After much prayer and conversation with TDP board and amongst ourselves, the Session voted last month to welcome them here. We will be doing some work on parts of the building to make it more usable for them—creating an entrance on the east side of the building and repairing the basement bathrooms. They will paint and create a comfortable and hospitable space for their guests. We'll keep you posted when the work begins. Please pray for The Dwelling Place ministry and our partnership with them.


Per Capita

Per capita is one of the ways that all of the congregations in the PC(USA) are connected. Together we mutually share the costs of operating the larger church (traveling/gathering, training pastors and ruling elders, serving in

the life of the wider church, and discerning in groups small and large where God is leading us).

The 2019 per capita fee for each member (excluding children who have not been confirmed) is \$42. The funds are divided among the Presbytery of Southeastern Illinois (\$29.24); the Synod of Lincoln Trails (\$3.81); and the General Assembly (\$8.95).

Funds not paid by individual members must come from the church budget, meaning that we can do less ministry here. Please pay your fair share.
