Dear Friends,

I like the season of Lent. It's quiet, reflective, and serious. It moves me to ponder deeply my own life and commitment as a disciple of Jesus Christ: to repent, to realign my actions with my beliefs, and to prepare for Easter. Again.

One of the convictions of our faith tradition that resonates with me is that we need to be attentive to the state of our spirit. We are always in a process of becoming. Following Jesus isn't a "one and done" promise. Our faith, our understanding of God and ourselves, and our response to God's great love for us is ever-changing—as it should be

Lent gives us time to wonder about that and to engage in new and familiar practices of prayer, devotion, and service that inspire us to focus on God.

To that end, the Faith Development team has purchased Lenten devotional materials for members and friends that will be available in the lounge on **March 3**. Please pick up the packet with your name on it. Those that are not taken on the first Sunday of March will be mailed to your home.

I will lead a conversation each Sunday during Lent, noon to 1:00 in the boardroom, titled Faithful Citizenship, so we can talk about how our faith impacts our civic responsibilities.

Also during Lent, I invite you to the chapel, where I will set up prayer stations, adding a new one each week. Come whenever the church is open during the week or on Sundays to pray, meditate, and think about what it means for *you* to follow Christ. The activities there will be selfguided. You can do them alone or with a friend or family member.

May this Lenten season touch your heart.

# **Thoughts on Church Membership**

Presbyterians have always placed a high priority on membership in the local church. Not all churches or denominations maintain rolls and not all churches or denominations articulate expectations about what membership entails.

For us, membership in the Church of Jesus Christ is a joy and a privilege. It is also a commitment to participate in Christ's mission as we are living it out here.

Here's how our *Book of Order* defines membership: An active member is a person who has made a profession of faith in Christ, has been baptized, has been received into membership of the church, has voluntarily submitted to the government of this church, and participates in the church's work and worship (G-1.0402).

It is the Session that is responsible for preparing people to become members, whether through confirmation or new member classes; for receiving people into membership; and for discerning if individuals are taking part in the life and worship of a congregation through their presence and support



congregation through their presence and support. That is done during a (required) annual roll review.

Obviously, there are seasons in people's lives that make active participation difficult. Illness and the limitations of aging prevent some from being here. Young people who are away pursuing their educations and transitioning into young adulthood also cannot/do not attend often. The Session does not remove them from the rolls.

For others who have relocated and thus cannot be here, who attend other churches, or who have chosen, for whatever reason, not to be involved in the worship and service of the congregation, the Session is called to counsel with them (as appropriate and reasonable) and then to remove from the rolls those unable to be a part of this community of faith.

For those who are living away from Danville, the Session encourages them to join a church where they live. That honors God and the nurturing they received at First Presbyterian Church! And for those who live locally, they can—at any time—be restored to active membership when they are able to commit again to meaningful participation.

It is because we value members—and membership—that the Session seeks to encourage folks to honor the vows they made when they joined the church.

If you have questions about membership, ask a Session member or Pastor Ann.

#### Service of Installation

March 3 will be a celebration of the "new" relationship between First Presbyterian Church of Danville and the Rev. Ann Schwartz, who will become our installed Pastor.



She served from November 2016 to November 2018 as our (temporary) Covenant Pastor. The congregation voted on October 21 to call her to a more permanent role, and the Presbytery approved that new relation-

ship in November. Friends and colleagues from the Presbytery of Southeastern Illinois will be present to help us celebrate at the Service of Installation at 4:00 p.m. in the sanctuary. A reception will follow.

# **Ash Wednesday Services**

While not every church recognizes it as such, Ash Wednesday is an ancient holy day in the Christian church. It marks the beginning of the season of Lent, which has traditionally been a time of contrition, spiritual practice, and renewal.



On Ash Wednesday, we have our foreheads marked with ashes in the sign of the cross. The ashes remind us of our mortality and call us to humble repentance as we

acknowledge our own brokenness and the pain that our individual and collective sin brings into the world.

While it is a somber and serious day, Ash Wednesday is hopeful, in that it reminds us we can start again. No matter how far we have strayed from God, no matter how long we have been away, we can turn around and focus again on God.

Ash Wednesday is **March 6**. There will be worship services in the chapel at **noon** and **6:00 p.m.** If you are coming to the evening service, you are invited as well to a soup and bread supper at **5:30** in the gym.

# **Camp Carew**




# **Workshop on Youth Mental Health**

# **Session Highlights for February**

Session held a stated meeting on February 19, 2019. Following are highlights of the meeting:

- 12 out of 13 session members present
- Approved an email voting policy: If anyone is against a motion or has issues with a motion being considered by email, it is no longer appropriate for email approval. It must be discussed in person, by conference call, or through Zoom or some other means that allows aural (where people can hear each other and can speak with each other) communication. The policy will be added to the Officers' Manual.
- Heard about a Small Membership Church Forum that will be held at Philo Presbyterian Church on March 26, May 14, September 10, and November 5, 12:00 noon to 2:00 p.m. Provided by the Presbyterian Foundation, the forum will provide a time for church leaders to learn from one another and identify "best practice" approaches to the ministry of their churches. Pastor Ann will attend.
- Rescheduled the Session retreat for Sunday, April 7,
   2:00-5:00 p.m. in the boardroom
- Reviewed the 2108 Church Statistical Report that Pastor Ann and Clerk of Session Libby Milner submitted to the General Assembly in February
- Approved a list of priority projects compiled by the Facilities team and a consultation with an architect to review the feasibility and costs of those projects
- Continued discussion about having The Dwelling Place, a drop-in center for those who are homeless, housed in the basement. The Facilities Team is getting bids for plumbing work and securing a safe entrance.
- Approved payment of \$400 from the Wilma Barry fund for each of the 4 high school youth who will attend the Presbyterian Youth Triennium at Purdue University in July. Presbytery is paying an additional \$200 per youth. The youth must participate in the Variety Show, and \$100 per youth will be reimbursed back to the church.
- Voted to consolidate the duties of the Gatherers' Group into the Finance team
- Approved taking an offering at Pastor Ann's March 3
   Installation Service and designating it to the Theological Education Fund of the PC(USA)

The next stated Session meeting will be Tuesday, **March 19, 2019** at 6:30 p.m.

# **Per Capita**

Per capita is one of the ways that all of the congregations in the PC(USA) are connected. Together we mutually



share the costs of operating the larger church (traveling/gathering, training pastors and ruling elders, serving in the life of the wider church, and discerning in groups small and large where God is leading us).

The 2019 per capita fee for each member (excluding children who have not been confirmed) is \$42. The funds are divided among the Presbytery of Southeastern Illinois (\$29.24); the Synod of Lincoln Trails (\$3.81); and the General Assembly (\$8.95).

Funds not paid by individual members must come from the church budget, meaning that we can do less ministry here. Please pay your fair share.
