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Church Work Day

Calling all Presbyterians! We need you on Saturday, **June 15**, 8:00 AM to noon for a (half) work day at the retreat site. Come for some or all of that time. The list of tasks is long, but you know the saying: "many hands make light work."

Childcare will be provided at the site. Snacks and beverages will be available too. It would be helpful to have some volunteers willing to pass out food and drinks.

The jobs include washing windows, applying algaecide (to remove green growth off outside walls), clearing debris around the building and from the road and entry meadow, cutting up and removing a fallen log from the meadow, and raking leaves near the building.

Facilities will provide the list of chores and refreshments. You are asked to bring lawn mowers, trailers, loppers, chain saws, shovels, and weed whackers.

Friends,

Playwright George Bernard Shaw once said, “The single biggest problem with communication is the illusion that it has taken place.”

Sometimes church leaders (me included!) assume that because a Session decision or an event was announced once or twice that everyone in the congregation is fully aware of what’s going on. We are then under the illusion that adequate communication has occurred, and that’s not always so.

At FPC, we use multiple tools to share information with you: bulletin announcements and Minutes for Mission on Sundays, the e-pistle (an as-needed email, usually once a week), and The Chimes (monthly). If you use social media, you can see postings on the official (public) church Facebook page, as well as the FPC Family (private) page. If you are so inclined, you can look for information on the church website. And you can always call the church office or a Teaching Elder with questions.

At the last Session meeting, we spent time talking about how we can be more forthcoming and more transparent with the congregation about our work so you feel well informed—and so you can know not only what we’re doing by why we’re doing it.

To that end, we are launching Coffee Talk with the Session on **June 23**. The format will be casual and brief. During coffee time/fellowship time in the lounge on the Sundays after Session meetings, Session members will be on hand to tell you about the top 3 (or 4 or 5 or whatever number) things you should know about the previous week’s meeting. You’ll have the opportunity to ask questions, to hear the “why,” and to share your support and/or concerns.

For instance, as the Facilities team and Session move forward with renovations to accommodate The Dwelling Place, you will hear about the plans, progress, and costs. Or as the Worship team explores improvements to the sound system in the sanctuary, they will tell about the options and how they will enhance your ability to hear. Obviously if you have questions about other Session actions, you will be invited to ask those as well.

We won’t stop the bulletin announcements, e-pistles, Chimes articles, or Facebook posts, but we will add face-

to-face conversation to our stock of tools to keep you informed.

The Session is still charged with the tasks of discernment and decision-making; that’s the Presbyterian way! But communicating with you is also the Session’s responsibility, and we want to do it better.

Meantime, if you are not receiving the e-pistle and would like to, provide the office with your current email address so we can add you to the distribution list.

Pentecost Worship

On Pentecost, we remember that the Spirit of God was poured out on all believers as they worshipped together fifty days after Jesus' resurrection. Just as he promised it would, the Holy Spirit came upon Jesus' followers, filling them with new life and new hope through a transformative love for God.



On **June 9**, we will celebrate that event and the birth of Christ's church so long ago, even as we rejoice that the Spirit continues to renew and empower us.

Wear red to worship on Pentecost as a symbol of the tongues of fire that represent the Holy Spirit. And please give generously as we receive the Pentecost Offering.

One of the four special offerings of the PCUSA, the Pentecost Offering unites us in a churchwide effort to support young people in Christ and inspire them to share their faith, ideas, and unique gifts with the church and the world. The Session has decided to give our local share (40%) to CASA (Court-Appointed Special Advocates) of Vermilion and Edgar Counties, which trains volunteers to advocate for abused and neglected children within the Juvenile Court System.

Following worship, the youth will host an ice cream social. All are welcome!

5th Sunday Worship

On **June 30**, the fifth Sunday of the month, we will worship God with acts of service. Following a brief time of prayer and song, the congregation will be invited to create a banner and assemble gift bags that will be given to the guests at the men's shelter later in the day.

The Mission team is asking for donations of 1" x 8" strips of cotton fabric (any colors or patterns) for the banner; items for men's gift bags (deodorant, soap, body wash, shampoo, Chapstick, decks of cards); and ingredients for the dinner we'll prepare (boneless chicken breasts or thighs, canned green beans, potatoes, cherry or apple pie filling, yellow cake mix). Use the sign-up sheet to indicate what you will provide. Anyone who would like to help fix and serve the meal in the afternoon is invited to join in.

- Reviewed bids and discussed options for building renovations to accommodate The Dwelling Place
- Reviewed plan for painting the kitchen and having new flooring installed this summer
- Discussed plans for “Coffee Talk with the Session,” which will begin on June 23
- Affirmed the Deacons’ decision to close the Food Pantry on January 1, 2020 and to pursue new ministries of caring for our neighbors

More about Per Capita

One of the hallmarks of the Presbyterian Church (USA) is our connectionalism. In addition to our connection through our polity (how we govern ourselves) and through our commitment to the gospel, one of the other things that binds Presbyterians is per capita, a universal funding source drawn from the whole church in order to support the whole church.

It has a long tradition in the denomination, extending back to the early 1800s, when it was collected so Presbyterians from the fringes of the emerging United States could easily attend church gatherings in the epicenter of the Presbyterian world at the time, Philadelphia.

Per capita continues to be the glue that unites us, allowing Presbyterians to connect with one another and govern ourselves for the good of the whole body. The 2019 per capita fee for each member (excluding children who have not been confirmed) is \$42. The funds are divided among the Presbytery of Southeastern Illinois (\$29.24); the Synod of Lincoln Trails (\$3.81); and the General Assembly (\$8.95). Session encourages all members to pay their fair share.

From the Desk of the Deacons

Big news from your Board of Deacons. At our May 2 meeting, we voted to terminate the operation of our church food pantry, effective January 1, 2020. The only cost to the church and to the Deacons for the operation of the pantry was the use of the church van monthly to go to Bloomington to pick up the donated food, but our discussion with Deacons and members of the congregation disclosed that the recent requests for food in the community had tapered off (probably a good thing), the foodstuffs donated to and given out by the Bloomington Food Pantry contained large numbers of items of little nutritional value, and we, the Deacons, didn't have the volunteers or storage capacity to acquire and distribute nutritious perishables. Throughout the remainder of the year, we will continue to discuss other alternatives to alleviate food insecurities in the community.

The Deacons would like to thank our longtime volunteers such as George Milner and Jim Gilliland who, for years, have made the monthly trips to Bloomington to pick up the food, and Jim and Marj Gilliland and church staff, especially Sheila Smiley and Paula Spriestersbach, who have taken their time to fill the food orders. We will continue to provide food and fill orders with existing pantry supplies until the pantry is empty, and to accept donations from the congregation of non-perishable items.

At our May meeting, we voted to continue to fund the amount of \$3,000 for our annual Summer of Service (SOS) project for youth employment. Our director, Kelly Whitehair, says that she has already enrolled youth for the program, but if our members need any youth services or have any public interest project suggestions, you should contact her at the church office. Any services to church members are free, as the youth are paid from Deacon funds, but donations to the Deacons are appreciated.

As usual, the Deacons are grateful for the continuing donations from the congregation that make our programs possible. Thank you.


