Worship

Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday is a somber and holy day, during which we remember our human mortality. The central practice during an Ash Wednesday service is the imposition of ashes. Because pandemic precautions preclude in-person worship, we will worship on Zoom on Wednesday, **February 17**, at 6:30 p.m. You will receive Lent bags in the days prior which will include a small bag of ashes (burned palm leaves from last year's Palm Sunday fronds) and a Q-tip. During the service, you will be directed to apply them to your own forehead and to others within your household. We will also celebrate the Lord's Supper that evening, so please prepare bread and juice or wine ahead of time. A Zoom link for the service will be emailed to you.

Lenten Sermon Series

Pastor Ann will preach on Blessings in the Wilderness during Lent. The sermon texts will be Luke 10:25-42 (Feb. 21); Luke 13:1-9, 31-35 (Feb. 28); Luke 15:1-32 (March 7); Luke 16:19-31 (March 14); Luke 18:31-19:10 (March 21); and Luke 19:29-44 (March 28, Palm/Passion Sunday).

Congratulations

Mission Matters

Medical Debt Mission Project

Right now, about \$1.7 million of medical debt is owed by people living near or below the poverty level in the 44 counties of the Presbytery of Southeastern Illinois, of which First Presbyterian is a

member. The debt does not come from bad decisions; it comes from seeking life-saving medical care. With medical debt on their credit reports, our neighbors cannot get jobs, rent homes, qualify for loans, or buy cars. Medical debt locks people into poverty.

Our Presbytery has decided to demonstrate Christ's love to our neighbors in a concrete way. Over the next several months, we hope to raise \$17,000 and partner with RIP Medical Debt (ripmedicaldebt.org/), one of several organizations seeking to forgive debt instead of collecting it. They pool money from donors to buy medical debt, which is then forgiven with no tax consequences for the donors or recipients.

Every \$10,000 donated to RIP Medical Debt can abolish \$1 million worth of debt. That means if we as a Presbytery raise \$17,000, we can wipe out much of southeastern Illinois's \$1.7 million of medical debt. That comes out to be \$216.19 for each of the 79 PC(USA) churches in our region, or about \$3.40 per member.

Our church will collect these funds during February and until March 10. Every congregation is being invited to participate. The offerings during the spring Presbytery meeting worship services have also been designated for the effort. Make your checks payable to the church, with "RIP Medical Debt" in the memo line and send them to Paula. The mission team thanks you and will keep you posted on the Presbytery's progress!

Malawi Fundraiser Update

Thanks to your generosity, we have surpassed our \$17,200 goal for the Malawi maize mill project. As of the end of January, we had received \$19,079. Amazing! For the next few weeks, we will gladly receive your gifts, which will go toward the mill's operating expenses. Make checks payable to the church and write "maize mill" or "Malawi project" in the memo line.

Coffee Sale

If you are a coffee drinker, you can get your daily fix of caffeine and support the Malawi mission project. We still have a few bags of freshly roasted coffee that was grown on the Mazunda property in Malawi. The coffee (whole beans or ground) is \$35 per 12-ounce bag. Proceeds will support the operating expenses of the Dorcas Maize Mill Project. You can either pick up your purchase at Lisa Taylor's home or she will deliver. Make your checks payable to the church.

Blood Drive

- Discussed Session goals for 2021
- Reviewed plans for the annual meeting (Zoom) on February 14
- Determined that we will offer the use of the gym to the Vermilion County Health Department if they need more space for administering Covid-19 vaccines
- Accepted bid from Xcell for \$4,000 to create overflow traps on the boilers
- Proposed reducing monthly rent for Big Brothers Big Sisters to \$250 since they will only be using two upstairs rooms instead of three
- Approved proposal from Mission Team to sell coffee from Malawi as an additional fundraiser for the Dorcas Maize Mill Project
- Approved communion schedule for 2021
- Approved Zoom worship for Ash Wednesday and Maundy Thursday and livestreamed worship for Good Friday

Annual Meeting of the Congregation

Memorials

The gift stipulates that we establish the June R. Jackson-Seitzinger and Grover L. Seitzinger, MD, Endowment Fund. Half of the *income* from that endowment fund is designated for organ maintenance and half for Session-approved youth programs. We may not use the principal.
