Dear Members and Friends,

At Tuesday's meeting, the Session voted to continue with online worship, meetings, and other activities through August, and not to gather in person. I know that this comes as a disappointment to many of you who are eager to gather; it disappoints me too, but I also think it is the right decision. Worship services have been "super spreader events" around the country. There have been COVID outbreaks at a number of churches, some local. Several other area churches have begun worshiping in person, but attendance is very small. With the increasing number of cases in east central Illinois, many folks remain understandably uncomfortable about being in large groups. And the restrictions about wearing masks, not singing, social distancing, and making a reservation—necessary as they are—also feel onerous for a worship service. So here we are . . .

Having little control over the situation—besides practicing hand hygiene, keeping our distance from others, and wearing a mask over our mouths and noses—is frustrating! Individually, we can do all the right things, but if others ignore the guidance from medical professionals, you and I and the people we love are at risk.

Let us continue to do what we can and should do. Let us pray for those who are ill and those who care for them. Let us pray for unity of purpose for our divided nation. Let us pray for leaders to be wise and compassionate. Let us pray.

Prayer for a Pandemic May we who are merely inconvenienced remember those whose lives are at stake. May we who have no risk factors remember those who are most vulnerable. May we who have the luxury of working from home remember those who must choose between preserving their health and making their rent. May we who have the flexibility to care for our children when their schools close remember those who have no options. May we who have to cancel our trips remember those who have no place to go. May we who are losing our margin money in the tumult of the economic market remember those who have no margin at all. May we who settle in for a guarantine at home remember those who have no home. The Deacons have voted to cancel the September 2020 church picnic at Kennekuk given the pandemic restrictions on gathering (and eating) in large groups.

Thanks to all who donated blood on **July 26**. As a result of the ten pints given, up to 30 lives will be saved/extended.

Session Highlights

The Session met via Zoom on July 28, 2020:

- 11 out of 12 elders were present
- Voted to worship virtually and keep the building closed during August
- Cancelled the use of the church for the performance of "A Christmas Carol" in November
- Approved a bid for \$8,400 to reseal the church parking lot
- Revised the building use policy to include a sanitizing fee of \$50 per room used by outside groups
- Reviewed preliminary bid from CV Lloyde for necessary upgrades to the sanctuary sound system and discussed funding possibilities. The session is waiting for a revised bid before a final vote on the project.

Facilities Updates

The church parking lot will be resealed and new lines will be painted soon. It's important, for the long-term life of the pavement, for that to be done every few years.

New cement has been poured outside the gym door. The old slab was cracked and uneven—and thus was a tripping hazard. For security and for temperature control, the window and coal chute to the right of the gym door have been bricked up. Eventually the gym door will be replaced.

Per Capita

Each member of the congregation is asked to pay \$42 for the year's per capita charge. The fees are divided among the Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly, and support the work of the larger church. So far, 47 individuals have paid their per capita for 2020, totaling \$2,106. What is not paid by members comes from the budget. You may send a check for your \$42 to Paula at the church address; write "2020 per capita" in the memo line.
